






#### Dearest Support Family,

This year has truly been a year FULL of firsts! Our hearts are so full by the support of our community that has led to 2022 being our biggest year of growth since we launched in 2012. We have held the vision of what's taken place this year in our hearts prayerfully and expectantly, knowing that we serve a gracious and compassionate God and that our community is extraordinary. Here are just a few firsts I'd love to celebrate with you:

- Being asked to provide training for Alachua County School Board Guidance Counselors.
- Providing county wide youth prevention for Alachua County public high schools.
- Opening our first safe home (with more to come!)
- · Welcoming our very first residents and filling every single bed.
- Onboarding and training our Residential Team to support our 24/7 new Residential Program
- Getting our first program vehicle for transporting survivors.
- Starting our first expansion project at Residential—adding more program spaces and 2 more safe beds.
- Developing a collaborative working relationship with two community crisis response teams made up of law enforcement, fire rescue, EMT, and mental health professionals.



1. Our Created Care Coordinator, Dr. Lakisha Scott, not only oversees the care of survivors in our Created Care program, but she also oversees our jail program and responds to referral calls that come into our office seeking help. Every call is complex and has multiple layers. For one 18 year old survivor, Lakisha attempted multiple times to find her where first responders thought she would be. Once located, Lakisha made sure that this young woman had supplies, appointments with various medical professionals, and knew her options for long-term care. For weeks, Lakisha accompanied this survivor to appointments, checked in on her, and made sure that she knew she had people caring about her. Her attention to detail in this young woman's life is a reflection of our entire team's commitment to getting into the hard places with survivors and letting them know they are not alone.

2. One of our new Residents needed extensive dental work upon entering our program (which is extremely common). Our Residential Coordinator, Brooke Sammons, took the time to prepare her for dental surgery, including getting in the kitchen side-by-side with and teaching her how to make homemade mashed potatoes for the first time so she had something good to eat while healing. This may seem small, but these are the shared moments of learning, growing, and being cared for that empowers survivors to keep moving forward and to not give up. This same survivor recently had a close relative pass away and Brooke drove her out of state to grieve and process with her family. Brooke being there in this capacity is a reflection of what it looks like at Created Gainesville to meet every survivor where she's at and continuously show-up to support and find feasible and sustainable solutions.

Thank you, community, for these moments and many more like these, where you have equipped us organizationally to serve our community and survivors from near and far with excellence, research-based practice, extraordinary love, and consistency.



# WELCOMING HER HOME



In February of this year, we opened the doors to our very first safe home. After many years of prayer, tons of support, and generous giving from our community, we were able to welcome the first of our long-awaited residents. Since then, we have welcomed five more women with open arms and open hearts.

"I was so blessed to watch the residential program bloom in so many ways this year," describes Programs Director, Laura Snook. "I have the privilege of working closely with women in our programs and individuals who are referred to us. Our staff does not take lightly the amount of trust and courage it takes for women to reach out to us, and even more to take steps toward healing. These women have been able to accomplish so much not only because of their own determination, but also because of your support!

Laura continues: "I want to share a story from this year that I hope will allow you to celebrate with us what God is doing here. A resident in our safe home, Macy\*, has been in programs since she was 16. She just celebrated her 26th birthday with us and has overcome every obstacle thrown her way. We are celebrating each of these victories with her:

- This is the longest she has stayed in a program and the longest she has ever been sober.
- She has grown comfortable being herself and has developed her own sense of humor (that we love!)
- She was accepted to volunteer in a hospital despite her criminal history. When informing her employer about her criminal history, she was met with love and acceptance and was seen just for who she is and not for her past.
- She was hired for a job she adores with an incredible employer, which is allowing her to save and prepare for her future.
- She was just accepted into a nursing program, which is what she is really passionate about.

- She has invested in her relationships with her family.
- She has developed new, healthy friendships.
- · And so much more!

"The many ways in which our community supports Created allow us to support survivors in their different circumstances," continues Laura, "including connecting them with specialized legal advocacy and speaking in court, filling the gaps for bills like rent and utilities, supporting Macy in realizing her dream of becoming a nurse and covering any educational expenses to go along with it. Community support, whether it is by volunteering, praying, or giving financially, has allowed us to support nearly 200 women this year in ways like this."

Staff at the residential home also help in providing emotional support and organic mentorship by simply being present with survivors through the hard times, celebrating milestones like birthdays and sobriety dates, providing transportation to appointments and work, and more.











"We laugh together, we cry together, and we keep showing up whether we're jumping for joy or grieving with women," says Laura.

"To our community of supporters: we could not do this without you, and we are so grateful for your continued "yes" to Created! We are looking forward to everything God has in store for 2023 and can't wait to share all of His amazing work with you."

#### What is Oasis?

Oasis is a special gathering offered by Created Gainesville every week to survivors from Outreach, Created Care, and Residential Care. Women gather to share a delicious dinner, worship, Bible Study, and community with each other. Whether a woman has been on the healing journey for one day or seven years, all survivors are invited to join.

This weekly event is a favorite for survivors as they enjoy refreshing fellowship and community. Survivors have the opportunity to share life experiences with each other in a judgement-free zone. In the safety of this atmosphere, survivors can celebrate each victory and support each other through all of life's challenges. Together, they grow to become leaders within our community and beyond.

## **2022: A YEAR IN REVIEW**

We connected with 126 women this year through our outreach efforts! Our arms of outreach allow us to reach women in all corners of the community — on the streets, in the jail, and at the strip club — which enables us to build relationships and show Christ's love.



An overwhelming percentage of all reported human trafficking cases involve victims under 18 years old.

Through our partnerships with educators and caregivers in 2022, we were able to provide

with the tools and knowledge to keep themselves safe.

Youth presentations are given to 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students so that they can access life-saving information about how to stay safe and help others when it comes to sex trafficking and sexual exploitation.



# WHAT'S NEW AT CREATED CARE?



A Created community participant, Amy\*, experienced tragedy earlier this year when her trafficker husband took their 17-month-old son out of state and prevented her from seeing him. To reunite with her baby, she had to fight the unjust charges against her, file for divorce, work through mediation, take over all the bills that were suddenly hers alone to pay, maintain her mental health, apply for jobs that would supply a consistent income, and lean into support systems like never before. Sound daunting? This is the story of just one survivor in Created's care.

Survivors of sex trafficking are often faced with seemingly impossible circumstances surrounding their exit from the control of their traffickers. Faced with the uncertainty of how to meet their basic needs for food, shelter, income, or safety, many survivors we encounter describe the possibility of escaping their situations as impossible, had it not been for the help of Created.

With the help of Created, Amy was able to bring her son home in October after seven agonizing months away from him. Although the transition to single parenting is challenging, she is thriving and has used this experience to grow when she could have allowed it to destroy her.

Created's non-residential arm of care, Created Care, is a long-term, restorative care solution geared towards women who are seeking to reclaim their lives. Created seeks to empower by walking alongside women like Amy in their journey toward healing and restoration. Through holistic and individualized plans, women in Created Care are able to focus on the physical, emotional, psychological, and spiritual healing needed to live an empowered and healthy life. Had it not been for the help of Created Care, Amy's story would have looked a lot different.

Amy isn't the only one who has benefitted from Created's services. Another participant, Mel\*, experienced many breakthroughs this year as well. "You could certainly say that she has stepped into the dignity and beauty she was created with," Laura Snook, Programs Director, remarks. Mel started the year in management at a grocery store. She was an excellent manager and was able to develop her leadership skills and gain experience there. Unfortunately, the workplace quickly became an unhealthy environment for her. Created Care empowered Mel to practice setting boundaries — she made the difficult choice to leave in order to protect her wellness.

At the same time, she secured independent housing in a tiny home perfect for her and her puppy. This allowed her to leave an unhealthy roommate situation and not have to move back in with her ex. Unfortunately, there was a short period when she had this beautiful new home but had no income between jobs.

Mel could have easily fallen back into old, dangerous patterns of making money, but with the support of Created, she was able to recognize what was best for her recovery and chose to wait on the Lord's provision of a new job. God provided for her in amazing ways so that she was able to pay rent on time, and He even provided a new management job at a company she loves! Mel is truly free from her old life and now loves encouraging other women and ministering to others.

We rejoice in the stories of Amy and Mel, but what you don't see are the countless others who benefit from the help that Created programs provide. This year alone,

- 14 women have been in Created Care.
- 6 women have participated in our Residential Program.
- 18 women attended Oasis.
- 75% of the women in our programs pursued education and/or found sustainable work options in safe environments.

- 100% of the women participated in trauma therapy.
- 83% of the women consistently participated in community groups

We are so proud of the determination, hard work, and bravery each survivor takes on her path to healing. We recognize that without the help of our community and supporters, these life-saving and life-changing transformations simply could not take place.

As we head into 2023, we look forward to another year of growth, both in the lives of survivors we serve and also in our ability to reach and serve them well. From all of us at Created, we say "thank you" for your generosity. Together, we can make an impact in lives like Amy and Mel, and together we can reach and restore many, many more.

#### Dear Created community,

As the newest Director of Created Gainesville, I have to say that God sure knew what he was doing when he brought me to Created.

A decade ago, as Alison was stepping out in faith to birth this organization, God was placing a desire in me to serve in an organization like Created Gainesville. At the time I was doing my own trauma healing and God knew I wasn't ready. As I look back today, I can see the "footprints in the sand" so to speak. I can see all of the ways that God has been preparing me for this opportunity. I can see all the times He steered me along the path, and I can see the times where He carried me through the valley. All the while never leaving me and always having my back. I am amazed at all of the details that God orchestrates because of His immense love for His children. I am forever grateful that He has made me for such a time as this.



I have been in this role since the end of July and have been blown away by the evidence of God's love on a daily basis. Love has shown up in the darkest of places and has changed the atmosphere. Love has shown up in the most desperate of situations and made a way where there was no way. Love has shown up in moments of determination to survive and injected hope back into survivors' lives. There is resilience here. There is strength here. There is so much hope here.

As the Administrative and Operations Director, I have the opportunity to see the big picture of everything that happens at Created. I have the privilege and honor of seeing the women we serve, the partners we work with, the community that supports us, churches who acknowledge and affirm us, the individuals and business partners who make donations of all kinds, the folks who sponsor Created in creative ways, and the volunteers who walk right beside us on the streets and in the strip clubs. I also have some really awesome "get to" moments when I am asked to step into a program role and get to know the survivors and how I can show them the Love of Christ. One example of this is when a call came in from a past participant who found herself starting over once again. She called because we had helped her in the past and on that day, she had only the clothes on her back and asked if she could come to the boutique to get a few things. After trying several ways to get here she called back to let me know she would not be able to make it without transportation assistance. So, I got her location and picked her up and brought her back to do some "shopping". It was a really humbling and beautiful experience to watch as she sorted through clothes and put together a much-needed set of clothing, accessories, and toiletries together just to make it through another day. We talked about her plans and what kind of loss she had experienced. Loss was not new to her and even though she was left without anything, she still had hope. As she shopped, she was beaming with joy and exclaimed how she felt like it was Christmas to her, and she called me an angel; a title I surely did not deserve. When we get these calls, we stop what we are working on and we give her our ultimate focus and attention. We do the very best we can to make sure she is seen, and known, prayed for, and loved beyond measure; without judgement, without hesitation, without expecting anything in return.

We have experienced explosive growth this year and we look forward to that momentum carrying us to the next level in 2023. We have plans to expand our youth prevention platform to reach more students in 2023 than ever before. We are looking forward to adding to our Created Care team so we can say "Yes" to many more survivors. We are opening up another bedroom to welcome 2 more women home. We are looking to partner with more local service providers. And, we are looking to increase our monthly donor partners and our giving campaigns to help us accomplish all of this!

However, our work is not done yet! Our 3 and 10-year vision plans include multiplying the number of safe beds at Created Gainesville so that when survivors are found or reach out for help, dangerously long wait times don't keep survivors from the hope, healing, and freedom that awaits.


